**Bear Review:** Kenyon Booker led 20th-ranked Shaw with 16 points as the Bears opened their CIAA eastern division season with a 61-46 victory over Elizabeth City State at Dorton Arena. Shaw (10-2) never trailed in the game and held its biggest lead of the half at 21-6 on a jumper by Harrell Butler (eight points) with 7:39 remaining. The closest the Vikings (3-9) would come in the first half would be 24-21 on a jumper by Jonathan Harris with 1:18 remaining in the half. The Bears shot 53 percent from the field in the first half and led 27-21 at halftime. The Bears used a 9-0 run to open the second half to take a 36-21 lead. The Bears then used a 20-6 run to blow the game wide open and took their biggest lead of the game, 47-27 on a Cedric Lusk (six points) three-pointer at the 10:53 mark. The Bears shot 50 percent from the field for the game and limited the Vikings to 34 percent shooting. Anthony Greenup was also in double figures with 12 points. Harris led the Vikings with 12 points.

**Dunk-O-Meter:** First year player Anthony Greenup has made 74 of 104 field goals on the season thus far for the Bears. Of his 74 made field goals, 34 are dunks.

**Where are the three's?** After shooting 717 three-pointers and making 269 last season the Bears started off the season by shooting only four threes against Claflin, making one. Cedric Lusk, who led the Bears in three-point shooting percentage last season made one of two three-pointers.

**Oh, There They Are:** After taking only four three-pointers against Claflin, the Bears took 10 against North Carolina Central. Making five and took nine against Presbyterian, making three. The Bears have now made 52 of 136 three-pointers on the season (.382). Cedric Lusk leads the team in three-pointers taken (59) and made (25).

**About Bowie State:** Bowie State cracked the top 25 for the first time this season and come ranked 19th in the country. The Bulldogs are in the CIAA's eastern division and are 11-1, 2-0 in the eastern division. The Bulldogs defeated North Carolina Central on January 7 92-76. The Bulldogs had five players in double figures, led by Stephen Moss-Kelley with 22 points. Tim Washington leads the Bulldogs in scoring averaging 19.2 points per game.

**When Last They Met:** Bowie State avenged a loss to Shaw a month earlier and rolled past the Bears 94-77 February 9, 2002 in Bowie, MD. Shaw trailed for a majority of the first half and went into halftime trailing 39-27. The Bears would rally and took the lead 54-53 on a Kenyon Booker (six points) jumper with 11:02 remaining in the second half. The two teams would then trade baskets, but Jamal Shivers hit the first of three-straight Bulldog three-pointers at 8:31 and gave the Bulldogs the lead for good. Shivers led five Bulldogs that scored in double figures with 25 points, as the Bulldogs shot a sizzling 57 percent from the field. Ronald Murray led the Bears with 24 points. Harrell Butler had 12 points.

**CIAA Rookie of the Week:** Bear freshman Brandon Beckwith was named CIAA Rookie of the Week for his play in the Bears three games last week: The 5-11 guard from Zebulon, NC contributed seven rebounds, six points, six assists and three steals. Beckwith has started four-straight games. In his first start versus Tampa, Beckwith scored 14 points on 6-of-10 shooting.

**Bears Ranked 20th in Latest Poll:** After a loss to then 23rd ranked Columbus State back on December 30, the Bears are ranked #20 in the latest NABC/Division II Bulletin National Rankings. The Bears were ranked #10 in the Dec. 17 poll and are currently 10-2 on the season. Shaw finished last season ranked #15 after finishing in the NCAA Division II Final Four. Columbus State, who is now ranked 10th in the country, is ranked first in the current South Atlantic Regional rankings.

**Something Has To Give:** Shaw is ranked first in the CIAA in scoring defense (63.7), defensive field goal percentage (.395) and blocked shots (5.1), while the Bulldogs are ranked first in scoring offense (86.9).

**Home Winning Streak:** Dating back to last season, the Bears have now won 10 straight home games, which is the 11th longest streak in the nation. The Bears last home loss came at the hands of Winston-Salem State 69-76 on January 17, 2002.

**The Iron Man:** Cedric Lusk leads the Bears in minutes played per game averaging 37.3 minutes per game. Four times this season, Lusk has played 40 minutes. The 6-8 senior from Long Beach, Ca. averaged 19.5 minutes per game last season.

**Regional Rankings:** The Bears are ranked second in the latest South Atlantic Regional rankings. The Bears are ranked 20th in the country.

**The Newcomer:** Jamaal Turner is a transfer from Division I Morris Brown in Atlanta. The 6-1 senior from Orlando, FL had a big game in his debut as a Bear against Salem International, scoring 11 points, handing out three assists and making two of six three-pointers.

**Double-Double, Double Figures:** Kenyon Booker has recorded a double-double in three-straight games. He has scored a double-double in eight of the Bears 12 games this season. Booker had eight all of last season and 13 in his previous two years combined as a Bear. He has scored in double figures 30 of his 58 career games as a Bear and has rebounded in double figures 25 times.

**Player of the Week:** Kenyon Booker was named CIAA Player of the Week for the week of December 2. He averaged 18.5 points, 17.5 rebounds, 5.5 assists and 2.0 blocks in two victories over North Carolina Central (11/26) and Presbyterian (11/30).

**Coach of the Week:** Bears head coach Michael Bernard has twice been named CIAA Coach of the Week for the weeks of November 25 and December 2.

**First Three, A Big One:** Harrell Butler hit the first three of his career in the victory over Fayetteville State. For Butler it was his first made three of his Bear career. Butler made the three with two seconds remaining to give the Bears the victory.

**Handling the Rock:** At 6-9 Kenyon Booker starts at the 4 position for the Bears, but one might not know it by looking at his stats, especially in the assists department. The senior from Clarksdale, MS is second on the team in assists with (39).

**Career Season:** Senior Cedric Lusk is having a career season in this his second year with the Bears. The 6-8 guard from Long Beach, CA, has career highs in points, field goal, field goal attempts, three-pointers made, three-point attempts, free throws, free throw attempts, assists, steals, blocks and minutes. He has played 448 minutes in 12 games and played 605 minutes in 31 games last season.

**Frosh Comes Up Big:** After having played in only two games this season, Brandon Beckwith shined in the win over Fayetteville State. The 5-10 freshman from Zebulon, NC played 20 minutes, was four of five from the field, had nine points and three assists. In his first start versus Tampa, Beckwith scored 14 points on 6-of-10 shooting.

**Home Sweet Home?** The Bears will not play one single game in in their on-campus facility Spaulding Gymnasium. Because of the success that the Bears had last season, the 1000-seat facility is not large enough to hold big crowds. Instead the Bears will play five of their games in 5,100-seat Dorton Arena and three of their games in 1,500-seat Broughton High School Gymnasium. The Bears played two games at Broughton last season and went 1-1, beating St Augustine's (1-10-02) 107-86 and losing to Winston-Salem St. (1-17-02) 69-76. The Bears have won nine-straight games at home.

**About The Schedule:** The Bears will have one of the toughest schedules in the country. Not only do the Bears play in the CIAA, won of the toughest conferences in the country, but the Bears play pre-season #4 Salem International (12/14), #18 Tampa (12/21) and #23 Johnson C. Smith (2/15). The Bears also play Columbus State (12/30), who finished #9 in the final polls in the South Atlantic region last season, Morehouse, who finished #7 in the South, eastern division rival Bowie State (1/11), who finished #6 in the South Atlantic region and Winston-Salem State (1/16), who finished #5 in the South Atlantic. All of these games are on the road.

RALEIGH, N.C. (September 9, 2002) – Shaw University President Talbert O. Shaw announced today that Michael Bernard has been named head men's basketball coach.

"We're pleased to have brought to this campus, someone who has proven he is the best and we know he will continue Shaw's basketball success," said Shaw President Talbert O. Shaw

Bernard had spent the last four seasons as the head coach at Fayetteville State University. While at Fayetteville State he compiled a record of 63-45 (.567). He led the Broncos to a second place finish in the CIAA Tournament in 2001 and was also named the CIAA Tournament's Most Outstanding Coach.

Prior to coaching at Fayetteville State, Bernard coached seven seasons at Norfolk State University where he compiled a record of 141-67 (.677). He led the Spartans to back-to-back South Atlantic Regional Championships in 1994 and 1995. He also led the Spartans to the NCAA Division II Final Four in 1994 and the NCAA Division II "Elite Eight" in 1995.

Bernard might be most noted for leading North Carolina Central to the NCAA Division II Championship in 1989. During that season, the Eagles went 28-4 (.875) and Bernard was also named Kodak Division II Coach of the Year. He compiled a 115-56 (.673) record in six seasons at NC Central.

A native of Brockton, MA, Bernard has compiled an impressive 321-167 (.657) record in 16 seasons as a head basketball coach. Prior to his head coaching stints, Bernard was an assistant men's basketball coach at Kentucky State (1974-76) and Norfolk State (1978-1984).

Bernard is a 1970 graduate of Kentucky State. He was a member of the 1970 NAIA National Championship team and was drafted in the seventh round by the Cincinnati Royals in 1970. He played two seasons (1970-72) with the Wilmington Blue Bonnets of the Eastern Basketball Association.

Bernard replaces Joel Hopkins who led the Bears to the schools first-ever CIAA Tournament Championship and first-ever NCAA Division II Final Four appearance.

"I am looking forward to working with a fine group of gentlemen that have had success on and off the floor," said Bernard. "I would like to continue the work that has been done by a fine coaching staff the last few years. Having been involved with this game for twenty-five years, twenty-four of which have been involved in this conference [CIAA], I think I am prepared for the task.

"I think when all of this is dissolved in the next couple of days and we can get to work, I think we'll all be proud of the work that will be accomplished over the next few years with this team."

Erik Webster-Rashad is in his first season as the top assistant coach with the Bears. Rashad will be the chief recruiter, offensive tactician and will be in charge of player development. Rashad has experience coaching and playing collegiately and professionally. Prior to conducting area scouting for the Portland Trailblazers, the Fort Lauderdale, Fl. native served as Director of Basketball Operations and assistant head coach for the Tampa Bay Thunderdaws of the ABA League (2000-01). Prior to that Rashad served as interim head coach at Polk Community College in Winter Haven, Fl. Where his team advanced to the conference finals. Rashad served as associate head coach at Norfolk State University where the Spartans finished as the all-time winningest team in Division II history before its successful transition to Division I. He has also acted as head coach/director of player development for the Shabab Club, United Arab Emirates. There his teams were two-time Group A Champions (1993 and 1994), as well as President 's Cup Semifinalists (1996). Over the summers, Rashad was head coach of the Guyana National Team that won the country's first-ever silver medal in the Caribbean Commonwealth Games and advanced to the Olympic Qualifying Games. For his efforts, Rashad was selected to coach the 1994 Caribbean All-star game. His first taste of coaching came at California State University, at Los Angeles where he was an assistant in 1990 and he has spent numerous summers conducting clinics world wide in conjunction with the Olympic Solidarity Committee for which he was granted membership. He has also worked with noted coaches and players such as Pat Riley, Byron Scott, George Raveling and Magic Johnson.

Rashad played professionally with the Harlem Magicians, which consisted of members of the original Harlem Globetrotters, Mexico, Denmark, Portugal and Morocco. He finished with a career 28 points and 11 rebounds per game average. He played collegiately at Nebraska Western Junior College where he led his team to the national tournament before moving on to Jackson State University and finally settling down at Guilford (NC) College.

Rashad graduated from Guilford College in 1985 with a B.S. in administrative justice. He earned his master's in educational counseling from Prairie View A&M University in 1996.

**RAY MARTIN**  
**ASSISTANT COACH**

Ray Martin begins his first season as a member of the Bear coaching staff. Martin will mostly handle the Bear defense and will have some recruiting responsibilities. A 23-year coaching veteran, Martin comes to Shaw after four seasons as head coach at Long Island University. Prior to that, Martin was an assistant for two seasons at Miami (OH). Prior to his stint in Miami, Martin served as an assistant coach at Florida Atlantic during the 1995-96 season.

The native New Yorker is no stranger to Shaw University or Raleigh, having served as an assistant coach at Shaw (1994-95) and helping guide the Bears to a 21-9 mark. Martin also served as an assistant coach at NC State from 1980-88 helping lead the Wolfpack to the National Championship in 1983.

Martin played his college ball at Notre Dame, where he was a four-year letter winner and Fighting Irish team captain during his senior season.
