the Broncos knocking the Bears out of the quarterfinals of last year's CIAA Tournament 73-56.

**When Last They Met:** RALEIGH, Feb. 26, 2004 – Fayetteville State University got off to a slow start against Shaw University Thursday, but pulled away in the second half for a 73-56 victory in the quarterfinals of the CIAA Men's Basketball Tournament at RBC Center. Fayetteville State (18-10) received a game-high 21 points from Donell Williams, the lone Bronco in double figures, on 8-of-16 shooting from the field and 5-of-6 from the foul line. Shaw (12-16) was paced by Ricky Williams with a team-best 18 points, along with Anthony Greenup with 11 points, 11 rebounds and six blocked shots. "When you can't put the ball in the hole, you certainly can't win basketball games," head coach Michael Bernard said about his team's 20-of-64 shooting from the field and 13-of-26 efforts from the foul line. The Bears jumped out to a 16-5 advantage when Ricky Williams dropped a three-pointer with 12 minutes 23 seconds left in the first half. The Broncos responded with a 12-1 run to tie the game at 17-17 with a pair of free throws by Donell Williams at the 9:02 mark. Shaw's Tomas Grinkevicius and the Broncos' Kenny Haywood exchanged free throws before a lay-up by Donell Williams gave the Broncos their first lead at 21-19 with 8:23 to play before intermission. Fayetteville State closed the half with a 7-1 spurt to go ahead 38-29 at the break. Shaw cut the deficit to two points twice in the second half before a 15-4 run by the Broncos put the game out of reach at 57-44 with 8:24 to go.

**About Fayetteville State:** The Broncos play are members of the CIAA's Western Division and are coming off a 75-66 victory over Livingstone on Tuesday night. David Pierce and Phillipe Harris had 15 points a-piece. The Broncos outrebounded Livingstone 55 to 31. Donell Williams leads the Broncos in scoring averaging 15.7 points per game.

**Last Time Out:** LAWRENCEVILLE, VA – James Rosebud led Shaw with 13 points and 11 rebounds as the Bears rolled past St. Paul's 79-49 at Taylor-Whitehead Gymnasium, The margin of victory was Shaw's largest of the season. Shaw played its most dominant game of the season. Shaw forced St. Paul's into 15 first half turnovers in leading 36-24 at halftime. The Bears (5-13, 3-2, 2-1) shot 50 percent from the field in the second half, while limiting the Tigers to 36 percent in the half and 38 percent for the game and forcing 23 turnovers. John Kornegay was key off the bench scoring 13 points. Shamaad Jones led the Tigers with 14 points.

**Shaw vs. Fayetteville State:** In the last nine meetings Fayetteville State has won six of those meetings. As a matter of fact, while Michael Bernard was the head coach of Fayetteville Stat (1998-2002) his teams did not lose to Shaw. The two teams split last season, including

**St. Paul's Number:** With Shaw's 79-49 victory over St. Paul's on Tuesday, Shaw has defeated St. Paul's 10 of the last 11 games, including 10-straight. This is the most dominant Shaw has been against any opponent in the last six years. The last time the Tigers defeated the Bears was December 8, 2000, an 85-63 victory.

**Favorable Stretch:** Tonight's home contest against Fayetteville State begins a "home stretch" in which the Bears play four of their next six games at home. Shaw had played its last three games away from Spaulding Gymnasium and five of its last seven.

**Streak Snapped:** With Shaw's 71-65 victory over St. Augustine's on Saturday, the Bears snapped a four-game losing streak. The streak tied for the longest losing streak during a season under third-year head coach Michael Bernard, when last year, Shaw opened the season with four-straight losses before earning a 68-64 victory over North Carolina Central on December 6, 2003. The last time Shaw lost more than four-straight games in a season was during the 1999-2000 season when the Bears lost 10-straight.

**Road Trip:** The Bears will only play a total of eight home games this season. The game against St. Paul's marked the last of three-straight games away from Spaulding Gymnasium before hosting Fayetteville State on January 27. Then comes a favorable home stretch for the Bears as four of the next six games are at home. The Bears end the season with three-straight games on the road.

**Rosebud Ranked:** Forward James Rosebud is ranked in the top 45 in the NCAA in blocked shots (2.0) 18th, rebounds (9.6) 24th and field goal percentage (57.1) 45th. He is ranked second in the conference in rebounding, fourth in blocked shots and fifth in field goal percentage.

**Bears Record Double-Double:** Sophomore guard Nate Aaron and junior forward James Rosebud each recorded a double-double in Shaw's victory over St. Aug's. Aaron recorded 17 points and 10 rebounds (also had six assists) and Rosebud added 15 points and 12 rebounds. The last time two Bears recorded a double figures in scoring and rebounding in the same games was January 6, 2004 when Anthony Greenup had 31 points and 15 rebounds and Cordell Maxwell had 17 points and 12 rebounds

**Just Like The Old Days:** Daniel Jackson, Terrence Christian and Willie Williams are all from Lake Wales, FL. As a matter of fact, all three played high school ball

at Lake Wales High School during the 1999-2000 season. All three are solid contributors, as Williams averages 12.4 points per game, while Jackson averages 10.3 points and 7.3 rebounds per game, while Christian averages 8.7 points and 5.4 rebounds per game.

**Season High Shooting:** Shaw shot a season high 58.3 percent against Elizabeth City State as Shaw was victorious 81-78. This was the second time this season the Bears shot over 50 percent. The Bears shot 57.8 percent in losing 77-61 to Valdosta State on December 3.

**Raleigh Kid Is Steady:** Jason Coleman is the only player on the roster from the city of Raleigh. The 5-11 freshman guard, who played his high school ball at Sanderson, has been steady at the point for the Bears. Coleman is averaging 7.7 points and 3.9 assists per game. He has started 11 of 12 games and had a season high six assists in the 81-78 victory over Elizabeth City State.

**The Lone Senior:** DaQuan Santos is the lone senior and lone player for the matter from last year's team. The New York City native is averaging 3.5 points in 9.2 minutes per game. After playing 45 minutes in just 11 games last year, Santos has scored in double figures twice this season, including a Shaw career high of 15 points against North Florida (12-28-04).

**Coach Bernard Nominated:** Head coach Michael Bernard is a nominee for the CIAA's 60th anniversary team. In 20 years, Bernard has an overall record of 357-195 as a head coach. Bernard won a national championship as head coach of North Carolina Central in 1989.

**Rookie Of The Week:** Guard Jason Coleman was named CIAA Rookie of the Week (1/1/05). The Raleigh native averaged 10 points, 3.5 rebounds, three assists and two steals in two games last week for the Bears. In Shaw's 82-82 victory over Tusculum Coleman scored 12 points, handed out four assists, grabbed four rebounds and three steals.

**Bears Picked to Finish Fourth:** The Shaw men's basketball team has been picked to finish fourth in the CIAA's Eastern Division as picked by the CIAA's Men's Basketball Association at the CIAA's annual Coaches/Media Exchange in Raleigh. The Bears finished last season 12-16, 8-8, third in the east.

**First CIAA Game:** Under head coach Michael Bernard, the Bears are 3-0 when beginning the CIAA schedule and have won the last four games when opening CIAA play.

**Another Double-Double Man, Almost:** Junior forward James Rosebud is almost averaging a double-double for the Bears. The St. Petersburg, FL native has recorded 11 in 17 games. He is averaging 14.0 points and 9.7 rebounds per game. Anthony Greenup averaged a double-double last year with 20.8 points and 10.2 rebounds per game and Kenyon Booker averaged a double-double during the 2002-03 campaign with 15.3 points and 11.1 rebounds. Rosebud sat out all of last season due to injury.

**Greenup Signs With Globetrotters:** Former Shaw star forward Anthony Greenup has signed a contract to play with the world-renown Harlem Globetrotters. His first tour begins this month and will finish up in April at the NCAA Final Four in a game against college All-stars. The signing of Greenup brings the number of players from Shaw to sign professional contract to four, since Ronald "Flip" Murray was drafted by the Seattle Supersonics in 2002,. Forward Kenyon Booker signed to play professionally overseas in Croatia in 2003, while guards Cedric Lusk and Cordell Maxwell have signed this year to play with the Maryland Nighthawks of the ABA. Greenup had signed to play with NBDL defending champions Asheville Altitude late in October before deciding to sign with the Globetrotters this week. Greenup averaged 20.9 points, 10.2 rebounds and 2.8 blocks for the Bears while leading the nation in field goal percentage (.711) on his way being to being named as an All-American.

On September 9, 2002, Shaw University President Talbert O. Shaw announced today that Michael Bernard has been named head men's basketball coach.

"We're pleased to have brought to this campus, someone who has proven he is the best and we know he will continue Shaw's basketball success," said then Shaw President Talbert O. Shaw .

Bernard enters his third year as head coach of the Bears. Last year, the Bears finished 12-16. During the 2003-03 season, he led the bears to a 21-9 record and a semi-finals appearance in the South Atlantic Regional. Prior to coming to Shaw, he had spent the last four seasons as the head coach at Fayetteville State University. While at Fayetteville State he compiled a record of 63-45 (.567). He led the Broncos to a second place finish in the CIAA Tournament in 2001 and was also named the CIAA Tournament's Most Outstanding Coach.

Prior to coaching at Fayetteville State, Bernard coached seven seasons at Norfolk State University where he compiled a record of 141-67 (.677). He led the Spartans to back-to-back South Atlantic Regional Championships in 1994 and 1995. He also led the Spartans to the NCAA Division II Final Four in 1994 and the NCAA Division II "Elite Eight" in 1995.

Bernard might be most noted for leading North Carolina Central to the NCAA Division II Championship in 1989. During that season, the Eagles went 28-4 (.875) and Bernard was also named Kodak Division II Coach of the Year. He compiled a 115-56 (.673) record in six seasons at NC Central.

A native of Brockton, MA, Bernard has compiled an impressive 321-167 (.657) record in 16 seasons as a head basketball coach. Prior to his head coaching stints, Bernard was an assistant men's basketball coach at Kentucky State (1974-76) and Norfolk State (1978-1984).

Bernard is a 1970 graduate of Kentucky State. He was a member of the 1970 NAIA National Championship team and was drafted in the seventh round by the Cincinnati Royals in 1970. He played two seasons (1970-72) with the Wilmington Blue Bonnets of the Eastern Basketball Association.

Bernard replaced Joel Hopkins who led the Bears to the schools first-ever CIAA Tournament Championship and first-ever NCAA Division II Final Four appearance in 2002.

## **Erik Webster-Rashad**

Erik Webster-Rashad is in his third season as assistant coach with the Bears. Rashad has experience coaching and playing collegiately and professionally. Prior to conducting area scouting for the Portland Trailblazers, the Fort Lauderdale, Fla. native served as Director of Basketball Operations and assistant head coach for the Tampa Bay Thunderdaws of the ABA League (2000-01). Prior to that Rashad served as interim head coach at Polk Community College in Winter Haven, Fl. Where his team advanced to the conference finals. Rashad served as associate head coach at Norfolk State University where the Spartans finished as the all-time winningest team in Division II history before its successful transition to Division I.

Rashad played professionally with the Harlem Magicians, which consisted of members of the original Harlem Globetrotters, Mexico, Denmark, Portugal and Morocco. He finished with a career 28 points and 11 rebounds per game average. He played collegiately at Nebraska Western Junior College where he led his team to the national tournament before moving on to Jackson State University and finally settling down at Guilford (NC) College.

Rashad graduated from Guilford College in 1985 with a B.S. in administrative justice. He earned his master's in educational counseling from Prairie View A&M University in 1996.
