LADY BEARS LOOKING TO MAKE HISTORY

Entering the 2005-06 season, the Lady Bears are focused on continuing their championship run in the CIAA and working hard to stay in the hunt for the National Championship. "We know we have our work cut out for us. It will not be easy to repeat, because the CIAA will definitely be strong as usual," stated Coach Jacques Curtis.

The Lady Bears are coming off a 32-2 finish that saw them win their third straight CIAA Championship and the NCAA South Atlantic Regional Title and finished #3 in the country. Eight returning letter winners will lead their quest to remain one of the top women's basketball programs in the country.

Leading the returnees is senior All-American candidate **Nastassia Boucicault** (5'6-Guard/Brooklyn, NY) and sophomore **Leslee Anderson** (5'9-Guard/Blacksburg, VA). Boucicault averaged 13 points per game and 6.3 assists last season and was an All CIAA performer and also selected to the South Atlantic Region All Tournament Team. Anderson was selected to the 2005 CIAA All Rookie Team, starting 12 games and finishing her first collegiate season

with a 8.1 point per game average. Adding to the strong returning nucleus is sophomore **Natalia Cothran** (5'8-Forward/Chattanooga, TN), senior **Jenna Bradford** (5'6-Guard), sophomore **Tameka Pease** (6'1-Center/Forest Park, GA), senior **Tameka Brown** (5'5-Guard/Wilmington, NC), sophomore **Ari Cureton** (5'8-Guard/Harrisburg, PA) and sophomore **Tavia Clemendorf** (6'0-Forward/Danville, VA). Bradford averaged 6.5 points per game and dished out 85 assists along with an impressive 62 steals as a reserve last season. Cothran finished as the Bears third leading blocker with 15.

The Bears have a strong group of newcomers that will give a sense of reloading. Topping the list is senior **Chanae Early** (5'5-Guard/Atlanta, GA) who led Trinity Valley Community College to a 37-0 record and a National Championship in 2003. Also joining the maroon and white is sophomore **Erika Bailey** (6'1-Forward/Newport News, VA), senior **Carletta Harrell** (5'9-Guard/Cleveland, OH) and sophomore **Jamie Goshen** (6'0-Forward/Chesapeake, VA).

The Bears are picked by the CIAA coaches to win it all again and are also ranked 4th in the country in the ESPN/Coaches Poll. This is the highest pre-season ranking ever received by the Shaw University women's basketball program. This is the "Big Show" and the excitement is high for Lady Bears Basketball.

LADY BEARS WIN FINAL EXHIBITION OVER M.I. EXPRESS-2

In their final exhibition game of the 2005 pre-season., the Shaw University Lady Bears defeated M.I. Express2 78-73.

The Lady Bears placed three in double figures led by senior All-American candidate

Nastassia Boucicault (5'6-G/Brooklyn, NY) who finished with 19 points, six rebounds and four assists. Senior guards **Carletta Harrell** (5'9-G/Cleveland, OH) and **Chanae Early** (5'5-G/Atlanta, GA) finished with 15 and 14 points respectively. M.I. Express2 was paced by **Candice Edwards** (Univ. of Richmond) who finished with 20 points and **Lawanda Newman** (Norfolk State) who had a double-double 13 points and 10 rebounds.

The Lady Bears will open the 2005-06 season at the Central State (OH) Tournament against Stillman College this Friday, November 18 at 6:00pm.

LADY BEARS WIN EXHIBITION OPENER OVER EA SPORTS

The Shaw Lady Bears tipped off their exhibition basketball season with a 99-96 overtime win over EA Sports. The EA Sports team consist of players who played NCAA Division I basketball.

The three time defending CIAA champions Lady Bears had five players in double figures and pacing the up-tempo attack was senior All-American candidate Nastassia Boucicault who finished with a double-

double, 26 points and 14 assists. Also in double figures was Chanae Early with 20, Leslee Anderson and Natalie Cothran with 13 each and Carletta Harrell with 11. Early added five steals and Boucicault finished with nine rebounds.

Pacing EA Sports who had four players in double figures was Shanika Freeman (Jacksonville State) who led all scorers with 27 points and 11 boards. Also with a double-double was Ebony Tanner (Richmond) who finished with 26 points and 12 boards. Courtney McDaniel and Brittany Jackson had 15 and 10 points respectively.

With the Lady Bears leading 85-83 with 15 seconds left in regulation, EA's Ebony Tanner scored on a lay-up that tied the score. Boucicault paced the Bears in overtime scoring 10 of their 14 points.

The Lady Bears will host Legacy Players in their second of three exhibition games on Monday, November 7th at 8:00pm. EA Sports will travel to Durham, NC on tomorrow November 2 to face Duke.

The Lady Bears have won 34-straight regular season home games dating back to the 2001-02 season. The last regular season home game the Lady Bears lost was during the 2001-02 season, a 98-93 overtime loss to Johnson C. Smith February 16, 2002. Last year was the third straight year without a regular season setback.

LAST SEASON STEAL MILESTONE
In the 2004-05 championship season the Lady Bears were the only team in the country to have three individuals with over 100 steals. All-CIAA Jessica Hawkins led the team with 122, followed by All-CIAA Kiarsha Curtis with 117 and All-CIAA Nastassi Boucicault with 110. As a team the Bears finished the year with 574 steals. In national rankings, Hawkins finished 4th in the country, Curtis 12th and Boucicault 30th.

1Lady Bears was number one offensive team in the country in 2005-04 with a 90.6 point per game average.

HEAD COACH

Jacques Curtis

In five years Jacques Curtis has taken Shaw University women's basketball to a level never before seen in the history of basketball at the university. Not only has he guided the Lady Bears to three straight CIAA Tournament Championships, he has turned the program into a national prominence.



The 2005-06 season will mark his sixth season on the bench and over the past three seasons the Lady Bears have broke the 27 game win barrier. They have also gone unbeaten (16-0) in the CIAA for the past two seasons. The 32-2 mark last season was the best in school history.

The Lady Bears also earned a birth to the NCAA Tournament the three seasons.

Last year they won the South Atlantic Region and a trip to the Elite 8, which was another first in the schools history.

In three years he has guided the Lady Bears to an impressive 90-8 (.918%) won-lost record. Also, over the past three seasons, he has guided the Lady Bears to a 41-1 (976%) record. They are currently on a 60 game CIAA win streak which includes post season play. In five seasons Curtis has posted an impressive 111-42 (725%) record.

Curtis was named the head Coach July 15, 2001.

He began his collegiate coaching career as an assistant men's coach at Shaw under the tutelage of Alfonza Carter now the Athletics Director. After his tenure as an assistant, he moved on to his first head coaching position at his alma mater Savannah State University as Head Men's Coach in 1998.

Curtis graduated from Savannah State with a Bachelor's degree in Computer Engineering Technology and went on to earn a master's degree in Information Science from North Carolina Central Univ.
