**About Virginia Union:** The Lady Panthers play in the CIAA's Eastern Division and are coming off a 75-59 victory over Virginia State on Sunday. Pria Stellmacher leads the Lady Panthers in scoring averaging 13.7 points per game. The Lady Panthers participated in the 2004 NCAA South Atlantic Regional hosted by Shaw and were the number six seed in the region.

**When Last They Met:** February 1, 2005 - With a late run in the second half Shaw turned a relatively close game into a lopsided affair as the third-ranked Lady Bears easily rolled past Virginia Union 101-60. This is the 46<sup>th</sup>-straight game Shaw has won over a CIAA opponent. Shaw (20-1, 10-0, 5-0) led only 33-28 halftime but opened the second half with a 21-6 run and led 54-39 on a three-pointer by Joy Hairston with 14:08 remaining. Shaw continued to pressure the Lady Panthers into turnovers, while making its baskets as was evidenced by Shaw's 59 percent shooting in the second half, 53 percent for the game. Joy Hairston led the Lady Bears with 24 points. Both Nastassia Boucicault and Jessica Hawkins recorded double figures in assists with 12 and 10, respectively. Hawkins also scored 15 points, grabbed seven rebounds and had five steals, while India Lopez had a career high 15 points. Andrea Bellany led the Lady Panthers with 24 points.

**Last Time Out:** Bowie State led for most of the game before the third-ranked Lady Bears took the lead for good midway through the second half and defeated Bowie State 93-88. For the Lady Bears it was their 49th-straight win over a CIAA opponent and assured them that they would go undefeated at home during the regular season for the third-straight year. The Lady Bulldogs (13-10, 8-5, 3-4) took their biggest lead of the game 33-20 on a lay-up by Allyson Hardy with 9 minutes 15 seconds remaining in the first half. The Lady Bears (23-1, 13-0, 8-0) managed to cut it to 40-39 on a jumper by Joy Hairston with 4:04 remaining in the first half. Bowie State took a six-point lead twice before going into the locker room ahead 51-47 at halftime. Shaw tied the game at 51-51 on a lay-up by Nastassia Boucicault 40 seconds into the second half. The Lady Bulldogs would push their lead up to 63-57 on a three-pointer by Tracy Cole with 14:47 remaining. Shaw outscored Bowie State 8-3 over the next three minutes and took the lead 66-65, which they never relinquished on lay-up by Kiarsha Curtis with 11:37 remaining. The Lady Bulldogs would hang around but would get any closer than three points. Curtis was perfect from the field going 10-of-10 from the field, 2-of-2 from three-point range and 4-of-4 from the free throw line, finishing with a game-high 26 points. Hairston added 16 points. Hardy and Cole had 21 points a-piece for the Lady Bulldogs.

**Shaw Vs. Virginia Union:** Shaw is 8-0 against Virginia Union in the last eight meetings, including three wins over the Lady Panthers last season, the last being a 90-65 victory in the 2004 CIAA Tournament Championship game, and a 101-60 victory two weeks ago.

**Wrapped Up:** For the third-straight season, the Lady Bears have wrapped up the Eastern Division two weeks before the CIAA Tournament. Shaw has no losses in the division, while the next closest team, Elizabeth City State has two losses. Even if Shaw were to lose its last two games against division opponents Virginia Union and Virginia State (Feb. 22) and ECSU were to win their remaining games, Shaw holds the tie breaker against ECSU.

**Shaw Ranked in Top 3 in Latest Poll, Number One In Region:** The Shaw women's basketball team is ranked 3rd in the latest USA Today/ESPN/WBCA Division II Top 25 Coaches Poll. This is the highest that Shaw has ever been ranked in the poll. The Lady Bears are also ranked number one in the South Atlantic Region. The Lady Bears are 23-1 on the season under fifth-year head coach Jacques Curtis.

January 11, 2003. Shaw went 21-0 against CIAA competition last year on its way to its first undefeated season in the CIAA in school history.

**Over 1,000, Over 1,000:** With her 11-point performance against Augusta State in last year's NCAA Regional, senior guard Kiarsha Curtis eclipsed the 1,000-point mark in her NCAA career, finishing the season with 1,004 career points. With her 25 points against North Carolina Central the Capital Heights, MD native scored over 1,000 points for her Lady Bear career and now has 1,189 points in her Shaw career. She currently has 1,398 points in her NCAA career. Curtis transferred from Division I Northeastern University.

**Player Of The Week:** Kiarsha Curtis was named CIAA Player of the Week. The senior from Capital Heights, MD averaged 30 points, five steals, 4.5 rebounds and three assists in two victories this week. In the victory over Bowie State, Curtis was perfect, making 10-of-10 free throws, 2-of-2 three pointers and 4-of-4 free throws.

**Thirty-Four Straight And Counting:** The Lady Bears have won 34-straight regular season home games dating back to the 2001-02 season. The last regular season home game the Lady Bears lost was during the 2001-02 season, a 98-93 overtime loss to Johnson C. Smith February 16, 2002.

**Third Straight Season Undefeated:** With the 93-88 victory over Bowie State, the Lady Bears will go undefeated at home during the regular season for the third-straight year.

**Curtis Gets 100th:** Shaw head women's basketball coach Jacques Curtis earned his 100th victory of his Lady Bear coaching career with a 101-60 victory over Virginia Union on February 1. Curtis, in his fifth season as head coach of the Lady Bears, has a record of 104 wins and 40 losses. He has guided the Lady Bears to back-to-back CIAA Championships in 2003 and 2004. Shaw is the third-ranked team in the country and is ranked number one in the South Atlantic Regional.

**100-Spot:** In its first game of the season, the Lady Bears defeated Columbia (SC) 116-53 in the Vivian Sansom Classic. Shaw has scored 100 or more points in a game nine times this season, the last coming in the 104-38 home victory over St. Paul's on February 8.

**Margin Of Victory:** Shaw is outscoring its opponents by 29 points per game on the season, which leads the nation. Against CIAA opponents, the Lady Bears average margin of victory is 30.6 points per game. The Lady Bears greatest margin of victory on the season has been 66 points against St. Paul's (2/8) and the least margin of victory has been five points against Bowie State (2/12).

**CIAA Winning Streak:** The Lady Bears are 49-0 against CIAA competition since losing at Bowie State

**Dishing It Out:** Junior point guard Nastassia Boucicault got off to a fast start with the Lady Bears and has sustained it in this her first season with Shaw. The Brooklyn, NY native could be the premiere point guard in the CIAA. She is currently averaging 12.7 points and 6.4 assists per game. Her 6.4 assists per game lead the conference and ranks her ninth in the nation.

**Stepping It Up:** After averaging 9.6 points for the Lady Bears last year, senior guard Joy Hairston is leading the team in scoring, averaging 18.6 points per game, which ranks her third in the conference. The Durham native is averaging 23.1 minutes per game and is shooting 38 percent from three-point range.

**In The Bahamas:** Shaw played in the Goom-bay Shootout in the Bahamas January 2 and 3. The Lady Bears lost their first game of the season to defending national champions California (PA) 60-48, then defeated Bethany-Lutheran 103-52

**What A Stretch:** At the beginning of January, Shaw played four games in five days. The Lady Bears flew to the Bahamas on January 1, played on January 2 and 3, flew back to Raleigh on January 4 and played back-to-back games against Lenoir-Rhyne and at Wingate on January 5 and 6, respectively. Shaw's only loss was to California (PA).

**Another Triple-Double:** Guard Jenna Bradford became the second Lady Bear in Shaw women's basketball history to record a triple-double. On January 3 against Bethany Lutheran, the junior from Baltimore, Md. Scored 20 points, handed out 11 assists and grabbed 10 rebounds. On January 3, 2003 Naomi Mobley recorded the first triple-double with 13 points, 12 rebounds and 10 blocked shots against Spelman in Atlanta.

Jacques Curtis is entering his fifth season as head coach of the Shaw women's basketball program. Curtis has led Shaw to back-to-back CIAA Championships in 2003 and 2004. Shaw finished 28-3 last year and hosted the 2004 NCAA Division II South Atlantic Regional. Curtis led Shaw to its best season ever in 2003 as the Lady Bears finished 31-3, won the CIAA Tournament and finished in the championship of the South Atlantic Regional.

In 2001-02, Curtis guided the Lady Bears from a 6-21 mark his first season to a 15-13 mark last year, with an 8-8 finish in the CIAA.

This is Curtis's second tenure as a member of the SU family, as he served as assistant men's basketball coach from 1986-96. He also served as softball and volleyball coach from 1988-90. Prior to joining Shaw, Coach Curtis was the head men's basketball coach at Savannah State University from 1997-98. His two-year mark was 20-34 overall, 10-20 in the Southern Intercollegiate Athletic Conference. Curtis also served as assistant director of auxiliary services at Savannah State from 1996-99.

Curtis is a 1986 graduate of Savannah State University.
